Cultural Awareness Training

Mirri Mirri offers two Cultural Awareness Training options to increase your understanding of First Nations Peoples and cultures.

Foundational

Our foundational workshop is an introductory session designed for participants who have limited knowledge of First Nations Peoples, histories and cultures.

Key topics include:

- Acknowledgement and Welcome to Country
- First Nations people and culture
- Kinship
- Connection to Country
- Dates of significance
- Appropriate terminology

Advanced

Our advanced workshop is designed for participants who have a baseline understanding of First Nations Peoples, histories and cultures.

Key topics include

- Unconscious bias
- Colonisation
- The Protection Era
- The Stolen Generations
- Trauma & Trauma informed care
- Inclusive work environments

On Country Experiences

Our On Country experiences are opportunities to strengthen team dynamics whilst gaining a greater understanding and connection with the lands of the Gadigal and Cammeraygal people.

We offer two On Country experiences for you to choose from.

Gadigal



Set in the heart of Sydney's CBD, the Gadigal experience is a tour of significant Indigenous locations that combines team building activities with cultural learnings.

Working in teams, participants will visit a series of checkpoints where they will be required to complete challenges that increase their knowledge of Aboriginal history and culture.

Cammeraygal



Surrounded by natural bushland and Garadi 'Black Cockatoo' walking track, the Cammeraygal experience is an opportunity to reconnect with nature and participate in various cultural activities.

The experience involves a scenic 1.2 km medium grade walk where participants learn about bush tucker and native plants, followed by cultural activities including weaving, spear throwing and fire making.

Experiences run for 2.5 hours and are suitable for up to 20 people.









Art and Weaving Workshops

The workshop provides an opportunity for participants to create and keep their own individual artwork whilst learning about the significance of art for Aboriginal people.

Great for team building, we bring all the equipment and resources to you.

Art

The workshop provides a therapeutic environment to learn about Aboriginal art, symbolism and techniques.

Participants are given the opportunity to create and keep their own individual artwork.

Weaving

Weaving has been a part of First Nations culture for thousands of years. Our workshop teaches the importance of weaving and provides a cultural experience where you create a bracelet of your own.

A great opportunity to strengthen relationships through meaningful conversation, this session introduces techniques used for weaving.

eLearning

Narrated by Paul Sinclair, Director of Education, the Mirri Mirri e-learning uses powerful storytelling to explore Aboriginal culture, European arrival, the Stolen Generations and Aboriginal activism.

The course takes approximately 120 minutes and is an in-depth exploration of the following topics:

- Cultural Practices
- Aboriginal People
- Torres Strait Islander People
- European Arrival
- The Stolen Generations
- Activism

A certificate is provided to staff to acknowledge completion of the training.

Our youth and leadership programs involve Mirri Mirri providing facilitators to deliver leadership and cultural workshops to young people.

Warada Program

The Warada Program provides a unique cross-cultural learning opportunity for your staff and female First Nations students.

Facilitated by Mirri Mirri, the full day program involves your workplace hosting female high school students, providing one to one female mentors and participating in cultural and leadership activities.
